In each of these novels a primary female protagonist responds to and copes with violence through communicative means such as writing letters or telling her story. In these books a female protagonist who has been subjected to violence or threatened with violence presents a persuasive discussion and convinces and influences men in their lives that they are worthy of empathy, support, respect and dignity. This study considers communication that is effective and communication that is ineffective. The protagonists who find effective means of using language to cope with violence exert agency, become the architects of their destinies, and show that talking and writing can be stronger and more powerful than brute force or nefarious, malicious actions.
